Education Elementary Education (K-5 Licensure) GPS

Program Coordinator: E. Johnson

This program is designed for students who have completed an Associate of Science in Teaching (AST) degree; however, other applicants may be considered. The Elementary Education program (courses specific to the discipline of Education) is a two-year program leading to the elementary (K-5) licensure in Tennessee along with a Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies, which gives students the broad exposure to content across the liberal arts disciplines that is necessary for elementary teachers.

Because AST programs differ in scope and choices, even within one state, all students will be advised during the admission process to King University and provided with an audit of their transcripts from prior institutions. This transcript audit will provide students a guide to the courses they need for the Interdisciplinary Studies major; these courses maybe taken prior to transfer or completed by taking King's Pathway courses. It will also clarify for incoming students how they will achieve three things: B.A. in Interdisciplinary Studies, Education minor, and requirements for licensure in Tennessee.

Students are encouraged to meet with King University faculty to discuss these audits and develop degree completion plans. Degree completion plans will take into account any prior coursework that may substitute for courses that appear here and will identify additional courses required for licensure in Tennessee that were not included within a student's previous college work.
